For example, use the Announcement tool

include virtual opportunities for connecting with students

Online Communication and Connection Strategies

Design your course menu to be clear for students to navigate through your course (e.g. Week 1 (Jan 4-9), Week 2 (Jan 10-16), etc.)

Show students how to access the Live Classroom in your course (link is included in the course menu)



Create a virtual space(s) for students to ask questions (e.g. an "Ask Questions Here" discussion board forum)

Decide on consistent ways of communicating with students. Then share your primary and secondary communication methods with students (e.g. announcements, emails, etc.)

Help students make connections between course content through quick videos that may:

- Summarize the previous week
- Outline topics for the current week
- Make connections to topics in future weeks
- Highlight the key concepts/big takeaways
